13 W. J. DURNFORD, called,
(Coldwater, Ontario)

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN:

Q. We are having what you say taken down so as
to have an accurate record of what you tell us about
yourself. You will be careful to say just what you
feel to be the truth? A. I will.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You saw Dr. Parke?
A. He is my doctor.

Q. Just a month or two ago, which would be in
December of 1938? aA. Yes, sir.

Q. And he diagnosed your case? A. Yes, sir.

Q. And told you about it? A. He and
Dr. Hippel.

Q. They told you what they thought? A. Yes.
It was cancer.

Q. Cancer of the rectum? A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Had you been suffering for some time? A. Well, I

was in kind of trouble in July, along from July on, and I thought it was piles, to tell you the truth, and it got so bad of course I went to Dr. Parke, and he took me to the hospital. He and Dr. Hippel went over me in the Memorial Hospital at Orillia, and he said that it was cancer of the rectum. Of course then he told me the only thing was an operation. I did not feel like taking an operation on account of my age, you see.

Q. How old are you? A. Seventy-one. That is, I will be seventy-two next June. He said he could not do anything except an operation, and when I got home they advised me to come up here.

Q. You have had no other treatment except this treatment here? A. No. Dr. Parke gave me a diagnosis to come up here.

Q. You began treatment here in December? A. In December, yes.

Q. December, 1938? A. Yes.

Q. You have had seven treatments, I think? A. Yes. Dr. Parke told me when I went back to come in and he would keep looking over me.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. He knew you were coming down? A. Yes. It was three

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weeks since I went in to see him, and he looked me over
again, and he said it was not larger, and if anything,
he could see it was smaller, and he said, "Certainly,
you ain't suffering as much; there is not the pain as
you were here before", I said and there was not the pain as
when I was there before. He said, "I see". I said,
 "When you went away I had to get away from you, but I
 ain't suffering much pain since."

Q. Had you any trouble with your bowels moving
 before? A. Well, I never was troubled very much
with that until this happened,

Q. When this trouble took place --
 A. Well, I will tell you, I will stop right up, and I
had to have an injection there.

Q. In order to empty it? A. Yes.

Q. You would have to have an injection?
 A. Yes.

Q. Was there any bleeding? A. Yes,
some blood.

Q. How about now? A. Well, I have to
take this laxative yet, you see, but I ain't suffering
very much pain. Oh, at times, there is soreness there.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. How frequently are
 you taking the treatment? A. Every week.

Q. Once a week? A. Yes. Just at
Christmas week --

Q. Have they any effect on you? A. Well,
 of course, just after I get home, -- I have about 50
miles to go, and I felt a little of a chill that night,

but then of course, I do not sleep very much at night.

Q. Are you all right by morning? A. Yes, but I feel a chill, and I am kind of active -- that is, all by myself. I get around and take as much exercise as I can.

Q. Well, that is all from you, I think. Thank you.
