(Gannetridge, Ont.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. You are Thomas Windette? A. Yes.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: The diagnosis card will be Exhibit 21. The clinic card is Exhibit 20, and the diagnosis card by Dr. Dowsley dated September 6th, 1938, will be Exhibit 21.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Had you been suffering for some time before you went to Dr. Dowsley? A. I had been treated by Dr. Hall of Oakwood, and had the radium treatment on it in 1937. I started from some time in the latter part of August, or around the 1st of September.

Q. When? A. 1937.

Q. How many treatments of radium did you have?

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A. Two.

Q. Where?

A. On my lips.

Q. Who treated you with it?

A. Dr. Hall

of Little Britain.

Q. Dr. Hall, where?

A. Little Britain.

Q. He put needles in?

A. He did.

Q. Did you feel him put them in?

A. Yes.

Q. You had it on both sides?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you smoke a pipe?

A. No, never have

smoked.

Q. What did it look like?

A. Well, it

just broke out in sores.

Q. All along?

A. No; one here, and

one there (indicating).

Q. How long did that last?

A. Well,

I have been troubled with it for a number of years. I
have a daughter who is a nurse in Toronto, and she ad-
vised me to go and have the radium treatments on it.

Q. It had been an open sore for how long?

A. Well, it would heal at times, and break out again,
but for the last six months it did not heal very much.

Q. You had radium?

A. Yes.

25

Q. Two treatments of radium?

A. Yes.

Q. What did that do to it?

A. Right

after that I had the X-ray lamp on it. He put it on
every week, and that healed both of them. This one
here (indicating) broke out, and this one here (indicat-
ing) broke out shortly after. That one (indicating)

healed perfectly. I took the X-ray treatment until about Christmas time, I think, and as near as I can remember, it would be the latter part of January or February when this broke out again.

5 Q. As bad as ever? A. Yes, I think practically just as bad as ever. My lips here (indicating) thickened, and were thicker all down here (indicating)

10 Q. How long after those treatments was it before it broke out again? A. Well, I would think about the latter part of January, or the 1st of February. It was about Christmas time the last time, I think.

15 Q. A couple of months? A. Yes.

Q. Then what did you do? A. Well, I just kept on, and went on that winter until I came out here on the 5th of August.

20 Q. From that spring until August? A. Yes.

Q. You just treated it yourself? A. Yes.

Q. Was it getting worse or better? A. It was not getting any better.

25 Q. Was it getting any worse? A. Well, my lip was thickened.

Q. What do you mean? A. The sore was getting thicker all the time.

Q. Up until August? A. Until I came here.

Q. And then you started these treatments?

30 A. Yes.

A. H. K.

A. Yes.

Q. What then?

A. My lip became softer

and naturally I could feel it beginning to heal.

5 COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Would you like to ask him any questions, Dr. Wallace?

10 COMMISSIONER WALLACE: How long was it since the last radium treatment until you came here to Miss Caisse? What was the length of time? A. You mean from the time the radium was put on it?

15 Q. Yes?

A. Well, that would be put on the latter part of August or about the 1st of September of 1937, and then I came here on August 5th, 1938.

20 Q. That is about 11 months time?

A. (No audible answer.)

25 COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. There was about 11 months elapsed between the time of the last radium treatment and the beginning of this treatment here?

A. Yes.

30 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. That is all, except I would like to ask you have you far to go today?

A. About 58 miles.

35 Q. Thank you.
