

15 MRS. ELSA GRAHAM, called,
(Raymond, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. Mrs. Graham, we are taking down what you say,
and I want you to be careful to say it as accurately
as you can? A. Yes.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Mrs. Graham's card of clinic
is Exhibit 22, and her diagnosis card from Dr. Fraser
M. Gregg, dated May 1st, 1937, is Exhibit 23.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: There is a letter attached
to Mrs. Graham to herself.

THE WITNESS: That came from the Lockwood Clinic.
That is where I went.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. The diagnosis?
A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Did you get a
diagnosis letter from Dr. Scott? A. No, I
did not.

Q. You were advised by Dr. Green to see Dr. Scott,
and have a section taken? A. Yes, but I did not
go; I came here.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Lockwood Clinic was
April, 1937? A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. There was no
definite diagnosis given to you by a doctor?

OTHOCT TORONTO, CAN.
A. Yes, Dr. Bastedo, first, and then to Dr. Gregg, and then to Toronto to the Lockwood Clinic, and they sent the diagnosis back to Dr. Gregg.

5 Q. You had an operation for the removal of the womb in Montreal? A. Yes sir, seventeen years ago, but I did not think it was for anything like that.

Q. Apparently the cervix was left? A. Yes, it was.

10 COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: She has super-cervical-subtotal.

Q. What age were you when you had that operation?
A. Well, it is 20 years ago. I am 49 years old now.

15 Q. You were about 29? A. Yes.

Q. You did not menstruate after that? A. No.

Q. You saw no blood from that operation until something went wrong here? A. Yes.

Q. How long ago? A. In April, 1937.

20 21 Q. What happened? A. Well, I had very bad haemorrhages. It started in this part here (indicating).

25 Q. They continued for how long? A. They only -- I came as soon as I had them. Of course, I came right here to the clinic, and about the third treatment I did not have any more haemorrhage.

Did

Q. /They take any little piece off this?

A. No.

30 Q. They just looked at it? and told you?

A. Yes. *Atk*

I told them not to.

Q. Were you treated here continually?

A. Up until the time the clinic closed in June.

Q. What date would that be?

A. April,

5 1937. The 25th of April.

Q. Who was the doctor? A. Dr. Cummings.

Q. He is a good surgeon? A. Yes.

Q. You were treating from April, 1937, and when
10 did it close here? A. June, 1938.

Q. And you have had no treatment since then at all?

A. I did not find it convenient to come in and have
15 treatments after that until November, and I have had
them since.

Q. Continuously from November?
20 is, just last November, yes.

A. That

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: It would be interesting to
25 examine this woman. Would you permit me to examine you?

A. Yes. I asked the doctors if it was very far ad-
30 vanced, and all they told me was, "Just far enough".

He asked the doctor how he found Mrs. Graham, and he
35 said, "She is ~~xxxx~~ chuck full of cancer all through her,
and she cannot possibly get better". I improved fight
from the time I took the treatment. I was not able to
work or anything; I was not able to drive in the car,
and I have driven in the ear ever since, and done my
housework, and I had not any pain since.

Q. Had you been taking anything for pain?

A. No.

A. No, sir.

Q. You were in for examination? A. Yes, sir.

Q. And you came right out, and immediately afterwards -- Q. I had a treatment on my way home.

Q. Did you have douches? A. Yes. I do that all the time.

* Q. Miss Caisse gives you a solution to do that with? A. Yes. I was so sick the day I came back from Toronto that I had to have my turn out-of-turn. I was so sick I could not sit.

Q. You are Mr. Holingshead of Huntsville, Ontario?

A. Yes.
