

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. There was no treatment given to you at the Lockwood Clinic?

A. No, sir.

Q. You were in for examination? A. Yes, sir.

Q. And you came right out, and immediately afterwards -- Q. I had a treatment on my way home.

Q. Did you have douches? A. Yes. I do that all the time.

* Q. Miss Caisse gives you a solution to do that with? A. Yes. I was so sick the day I came back from Toronto that I had to have my turn out-of-turn. I was so sick I could not sit.

16 SAM HOLINGSHEAD, called,
(Huntsville, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. You are Mr. Holingshead of Huntsville, Ontario?

A. Yes.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Exhibit 25 will be Mr. Holingshead's clinic card.

EXHIBIT NO. 24: Clinic card, re Mr. Sam Holingshead, March 27, 1937.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You went into the Orillia Hospital for X-ray? A. Yes. That is about 2 years ago -- a year ago. In 1937, in March.

Q. In March, 1937? A. I think it was March.

Q. And you had a plate taken at that time?

A. I had either five or six taken.

Q. Five or six plates. Was a diagnosis made of you there, or did they tell you what was the matter?

A. Yes.

5 Q. What did they say? A. They said that I had a very serious trouble; I had a growth in between my two stomachs, -- in between my two stomachs they said there was a diseased growth. I have a little story when you are ready.

10 COMMISSIONER WALLACE: You just go right ahead, but do it slowly.

15 THE WITNESS: I said how would I get it out of there, if I did not have an operation, and he said I would have to have an operation, and, "you cannot get it out of there unless you have an operation". I thought all the time I would come and see Miss Caisse, though. He said, "You can go home now, and talk this over with your boys, and if they decide on having an operation, you come back, and I will send the plates to Toronto to my uncle, and he will operate on you."

20 I came home, and I came to Miss Caisse, and I told her about it, and she said, "Who is your doctor?" and I said, "I have practically really no doctor, but I went to Dr. Evans, and he thought it was indigestion I had, and he gave me a bottle of something, and I took a few doses of it, and it did not do any good". Miss Caisse said, "You are very wise not to have an operation." I said, "Do you think I am?" She said, "Yes, I know it".

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I said, "Do you think you can do me good?" and she said, "Yes, I can". I said, "I am very pleased to hear it. You can give me treatments, and I will come and take them". I did, and I took about eleven, and on the following 14th of August, I felt ~~xx~~ it leave my stomach, and it went right out of me. Everything before that that I passed was as thin as water, and I felt this go down, and on and out of me. I was very foolish in not catching it. It seemed to be about 4 inches long, and about $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in diameter.

Q. That is, the cancer? A. Well, it was the growth that was there, -- whatever it was. It might have been a cancer; I do not know anything about it.

Q. You felt this thing go on through?

A. I certainly did. It went through me, and out of me. I could feel it about 4 inches long, and about $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in size. After that I could eat anything I liked.

I felt so good I felt hungry, and I felt so good, I just could eat what I wanted to eat. Now, I can eat anything, but the real sour things, such as pickles, and that, which go against me. It seems as though they will not digest properly, and will give me pain.

I can eat anything else, especially lots of meat, good fat bacon, and pork, and I can eat that all along.

Q. How long did you continue the treatment?

A. Well, I took 11, and this left me, and I took on and off from that. I took about a month regular every week, and since that I have only taken them in about three weeks,

and in the most two months. Last, I think, I was down here between the 1st and 4th, - along there - and I have not been here since the last of November.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Before you took these treatments were you eating very well?

A. No.

Q. If you ate a full meal what would happen?

A. Well, it would lay in my stomach, and I would vomit it out.

Q. Did that happen very often? A. Well, I guess about 100 times or more.

Q. Did you lose weight? A. Yes; I dropped 22 pounds in about 2 weeks.

Q. Have you gained it back? A. Yes, I have gained it back now. I am hardly normal. I was within two or three pounds of being normal now.

Q. What do you weigh now? A. 143 or 144 now.

Q. You have weighed up to 157? A. Yes, I have weighed more than that. I have weighed up to 170, and 65, along there, and then 150 and 155 pounds, and sometimes it would drop down a little again. After I got older it used to drop to about 150, but I certainly believe if I had not come here I would have been dead long before this.

Q. Did you take any other treatment --

A. No.

Q. -- of any kind? A. No. She did wonderful work for me.

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BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Do you feel quite well in every way? A. Yes, I feel fine.

Q. Do you do any work? A. Yes.

Q. What is your occupation? A. Well now, I do any job I get a chance to do.

Q. You live in Huntsville in town? A. Not in town; I have a home out of town, but I can work along day now.

Q. Yes, I see. Thank you very much. You have not far to go today? A. No.

Q. That is all.

17 JOHN McNEE, called,
(Utterson, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. What you are going to say is being taken down. We are not swearing you, but anything you say will be as accurate as possible?

THE WITNESS: You can see as much as I can tell you, pretty near. It was cancer I had on the lip, and Dr. McGiven cut it out about 19 years ago. It grew again, and I think I started about 4 years ago with Miss Caisse, and you see it is dried right up.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Dr. McGiven is now dead? A. Yes.

Q. He died of cancer himself? A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. That was how many years
