

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Do you feel quite well in every way? A. Yes, I feel fine.

Q. Do you do any work? A. Yes.

Q. What is your occupation? A. Well now, I do any job I get a chance to do.

Q. You live in Huntsville in town? A. Not in town; I have a home out of town, but I can work along day now.

Q. Yes, I see. Thank you very much. You have not far to go today? A. No.

Q. That is all.

17 JOHN McNee, called,  
(Utterson, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. What you are going to say is being taken down. We are not swearing you, but anything you say will be as accurate as possible?

THE WITNESS: You can see as much as I can tell you, pretty near. It was cancer I had on the lip, and Dr. McGiven cut it out about 19 years ago. It grew again, and I think I started about 4 years ago with Miss Caisse, and you see it is dried right up.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Dr. McGiven is now dead? A. Yes.

Q. He died of cancer himself? A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. That was how many years

ago? Was it 4 years ago? A. Well, since Mr. McGiven cut it out it is about 19 years.

Q. I see.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. About 19 years ago?

5 A. Yes, about 19 years ago, he cut it out.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Is there any card here?

10 COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: No card. We have no exhibits in this case at all.

Q. You had trouble about 4 years ago?

A. Yes, and probably more than that. It is about 4 years ago since it started. It was going probably 3 years before that time.

15 Q. That time, four years ago, you came direct to Miss Caisse? A. Yes.

Q. You did not go to anyone else? A. I went to Dr. McGiven, and he advised me to go to Toronto and use radium.

20 Q. Did you? A. No, I did not go to Toronto; I came here then.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Why did you come here? A. Well, they said that she was doing good work, and I thought I would try it.

25 Q. You heard that from others? A. Yes, and I asked Dr. McGiven if it would be all right, and he said, "No, I would not advise it; you go to Toronto, and use radium". Irregardless of that, I came here any-  
30 way.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. About 4 years ago?

A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. That would have been in 1935?

A. Yes, 1934 or 1935.

5 I used the treatment about six months.

Q. And you stopped treatment after that?

A. Stopped treatment after that.

Q. Because the trouble had disappeared?

10 A. The trouble had disappeared. There was nothing to do. I used an absorbent cotten, and some of her medicine, and took a bit of sticking plaster, and put it across it, and day by day there would be a drop of yellow stuff on that cotton every morning. I used  
15 that for pretty near six months, and for the last two or three weeks there was not a thing came out of it. It simply healed up with it.

23 Q. Is that all the treatment you took?

20 A. I did. I washed it with the same stuff night and morning.

Q. You took no injections?

A. Took

no injections whatever.

25 BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. You did not take any injections?

A. No.

Q. You did not take any injections? A. No.

Q. Just a local treatment? A. Just

an outside treatment, -- a local treatment.

30 Q. What did it look like when you started with

Miss Caisse?

A. Well, it was like a

big wart; it was raised up, but it was not  
altogether broke. There was a kind of raw place in  
the centre.

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BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. No further treat-  
ment since that time? A. No.

Q. You have not been back here at all?

A. No, no treatment at all since. I shave every day,  
and it never hurts a bit. You never feel anything.

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Q. I think that is all except I want to ask you

how far you have to go home? A. About fifteen miles;  
it is not so far.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

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We are taking down what you say just to have the  
record for the purpose of the convenience of the other  
Commissioners, and you will be careful to use your  
memory as accurately as you can? A. Yes.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: We are not swearing you in?

A. No. Well, I had been doctoring for practically a  
year with the doctors, and they were giving me all  
kinds of medicine, and it did not seem to do me any  
good. So I had an X-ray taken in Orillia ---

Q. At what time was that?

A. That  
was in the spring of 1935, I believe.
