BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

Q. Mrs. Heinbecker, you are from Kitchener, Ontario?

A. I am.

Q. 140 Water Street, I believe? A. Yes.

20 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had a major operation in 1931 under Dr. Bruce? A. Yes.

Q. In 1931? A. Yes.

Q. Then you went to Dr. Hett in 1937?

A. Yes.

25 Q. Why did you go? A. The trouble came back on me, and I was told that he cured cancer, and so he does, but a person has to be a millionaire before they can afford it, and it took an awful lot of money, and I thought I was cured, but I was not.

30 BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. When did your trouble

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return? A. Three years after the operation.

Q. That would be in 1934, as June 1931 was the date of the operation. Dr. Bruce operated in June, 1931, and three years later something else happened?

5 A. It is on that card; I do not want any mistake.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLAGE: Q. From 1934, until 1937, you had trouble, and, did you go to anyone before you went to Dr. Hett? A. No.

10 BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. What were you complaining of? A. Pain.

Q. In your abdomen? A. No, the vagina.

15 Q. Did you have any growth? A. I also had when I came to Miss Caisse a year ago last October just there, and that is all gone.

Q. Did you have any bleeding? A. No, not at all.

20 Q. Is there a growth in the passage now? A. I have an idea there is something in there, but of course it is getting better slowly, and so I am taking the treatments. There is no pain left of any kind.

25 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. When you first took your treatment here in October, 1937, -- is that correct? A. October 11th, I came down here for my first treatment.

Q. Have you continued taking the treatments since that time? A. No sir. I quit the last week in March, thinking I was cured.

30 Q. Of 1938? A. Yes.

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Q. And then came back when? A. I came back on the 18th of November of this year, -- in 1938.

Q. And you have taken treatments since then?
A. Twice a week.

5 BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Did any doctor tell you you had cancer? A. Dr. Freeburn told me before I went to Toronto for the operation, and Dr. Bruce told me, and Dr. Hett told me when I was taking treatments from him.

10 Q. Anyone else? A. No, sir; I have not been to anyone else since. I have lost faith in some of the doctors.

26 Q. Well, if you had a good pain somewhere you might go to a doctor? A. Sure.

15 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You did have an examination by Dr. Dodds in 1938? A. With the electric instrument.

20 Q. What was his statement to you then? A. Well, he pronounced me entirely cured.

Q. He is in Bracebridge? A. Yes. He is a chiropractor, and with that electric instrument he has

25 Q. Is that the instrument which goes around and indicates what you have? A. It is a little different. There are all kinds of buttons he pulls, and turns, and he is busy with both hands.

Q. He is busy with both hands? A. He has that one here, but not the other one.

30 BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Would you permit me

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Q. What is your trouble? A. Well, I had very bad teeth, and I saw the doctor, and he told me to have them out. He said I had pyorrhea. He noticed a spot on my cheek and he told me it was cancer.

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Q. How big was it? A. About the size of a small nickel -- the small five cent piece. It had been there for five years -- three or four years -- and I just thought that it was a wart, and I never did anything about it. I had one come on there (indicating) and I put gypsum and lemon on it, and it took it off, and I tried gypsum and lemon on the inside of the mouth, and it would not fix on it.

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Dr. Oakes advised me either to come here, or go to Toronto and have it looked after, and he said, "I cannot help you on that."
