BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN:

Q. What is your trouble? A. Well, I
10 had very bad teeth, and I saw the doctor, and he told
me to have them out. He said I had pyorrhea. He
noticed a spot on my cheek and he told me it was cancer.

Q. How big was it? A. About the size of
15 a small nickel -- the small five cent piece. It had
been there for five years -- three or four years -- and
I just thought that it was a wart, and I never did any-
thing about it. I had one come on there (indicating)
and I put gypsum and lemon on it, and it took it off,
20 and I tried gypsum and lemon on the inside of the
mouth, and it would not fix on it.

Dr. Oakes advised me either to come here, or go
to Toronto and have it looked after, and he said, "I
cannot help you on that."

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BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. They did not take
any little pieces off it to examine? *MLL* A. No.

Q. But those things disappeared after you took this treatment? A. Well, you see,

I started with taking treatments until the time she told me it had practically gone off, yes. There were two spots; one there, (indicating), and one down there (indicating) and they kept getting smaller. This one was not a very small spot, but it has disappeared now, They kept getting smaller, and it did not give me any trouble at all. Then, at the time she closed down, it was improving so well she decided I would not need to come only every other week, and up to that time, I had come every week.

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The next week she was closed up for about four months, and I did not get treatments. From that time it got worse, and it spread to the extent that it has not got back to this place yet. It is not back yet to where it was when she closed down, although it is improving, and on one little small spot it has disappeared altogether.

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The one on this side here (indicating) is getting considerably smaller, but the one on the bottom here (indicating) spread quite a lot during the time -- it has got very much smaller.

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Q. It got worse after she shut down? When you started back on the treatments, what happened?

A. Well, it started improving very slowly. One spot has gone entirely. I have been laid up with the flu for a couple of weeks, and from that time it settled in my

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mouth.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: I will look at it. It is leucoplakia, Dr. Wallace. Would you like to look at it?

5 COMMISSIONER WALLACE: I saw another one this morning.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: It has that white film.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Have you any pain?

A. No, not at all.

10 Q. Any discomfort when you eat? A. Well, it is disagreeable feeling sometimes more than others. It feels as if I had had cloves for extracting teeth, or something like that, -- a kind of numb feeling.

15 Q. That is a lax feeling? A. Yes. It made me remember about the time after I had my gums frozen to have my teeth out.

Q. How many treatments do you have a week now?
A. One.

20 Q. And you have taken treatments all the time, except the time the clinic was closed? $\frac{1}{2}$ A. Yes, with the exception of two or, maybe three times that I have missed.

25 Q. How far away is your home from here?
A. 28 miles north of here, on the Parry Sound road.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Is that all you want?

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: It is.

30 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. What is your occupation? A. Brick-layer, and stone mason.
