10 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had a little piece
taken out of there? A. Yes. *biopsy*

Q. Where was that done? A. A year ago last
September.

15 Q. Where? A. At the General
Hospital. Dr. Richards was away when I was there.

Q. Did you go back in November? A. No, I
never returned. I was away up north, and I was not in
Roseau at the time. I was up near Timmins, and it never
bothered me, and yet it was never sore.

20 Q. You just had the one radium treatment in
Toronto? A. Yes.

Q. Had you already the radium treatment?
A. I did not know there was such a ~~place~~ place.

25 Q. When did you come here? A. Last November.

Q. Last November -- in 1938? A. Yes.

Q. You came in November, 1937? A. Yes.

Q. November, 1937 -- A. A couple of months
after I came out of the hospital;

30 Q. And you had radium treatments until within a
month and a half from the time that you got your first *MLK*

treatment here?

A. No, I just had the one radium treatment. I was about four days in the hospital.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. How long after did you get this treatment?
A. Well, it would be pretty near three months.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had your radium treatment on September 22nd?
A. And I came here.

Q. And you came here two months later?
A. Yes.

Q. When did you have your treatments?
A. From then on.

Q. Continuously since that time? A. Yes.

Q. Where is it? A. Right there.

Q. It is a white formation all over your mouth?
A. Yes.

Q. And your gums? A. Yes.

Q. It will take a long time to cure you of that?
A. It is drying up, don't you think?

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: It is leucoplakia. ??

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Do you do anything now?
A. I am working.

Q. What do you do? A. Carpenter work in the summer time, mostly.

Q. This does not bother you in any sense, as far as working is concerned?
A. No, except a little excess saliva, that is all.

Q. Does it feel a bit dead, as though it were frozen?
A. Yes.

Q. That is all.

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COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: I think we will adjourn
now until tomorrow morning at the hour of 10.30 o'clock
A.M.
