EXHIBIT NO. 36: Clinic card re Mrs. Douglas Scott, July 4, 1937.

5 THE WITNESS: I was wondering if I could have the plates read, and you doctors could give me something definite, I would be very pleased. All the doctors seem to have a different story.

10 COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Thank you very much. It is nice of you to come and talk about it.

15 WILLIAM PEACOCK, called,
(South River, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE:

20 Mr. Peacock, what you are saying is being taken down. You will just be careful to try to give it as clearly as you remember your story. You had some trouble with your lip, had you not? A. Yes.

Q. When did that occur or begin? When did you notice it first? A. Well, as near as I can tell you, about a year and a half or two years before I came here.

25 Q. That would be about two years ago, would it? A. Yes, I guess it would be, now; that is pretty close.

Q. Did you go to a doctor? A. Yes.

Q; Where, and to whom? A. South River, to

30 Dr. Dawson.

Q. What did he say, and how did he treat you?

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A. Well, he put a batch of salve on it like ointment,
and he sent me home for two or three days and asked me
to come back again.

Q. Did he say what the trouble was? A. Well,
5 he said it might be pre-cancer, but he did not say it
was.

Q. Did it clear up? A. What is this?

Q. Did it clear up, or get better?
A. Well, no.

Q. It did not? A. No.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Had you any other treat-
ment except this salve that he put on? A. Yes, he
put a little, -- I think I was there about three times,
15 and called on him, and the last time he put a little
liquid caustic to it.

Q. He cauterized it.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Then you came here?
A. Yes.

Q. In April, 1937, is that right? A. Sometime
20 in April, but I could not just tell you the day.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. You had no other
treatment except this cauterization? A. No.

Q. Before you came here? A. Yes.

Q. Do you smoke a pipe? A. Not now.

Q. Did you? A. I smoked cigarettes.

Q. You let the cigarette hang there (indicating
lip)? A. No.

Q. Has any change taken place in this since you

came here? A. Well, it has not been paining at all since I came.

5 Q. Does it look about the same? A. Well, sometimes it changes a little bit, and sometimes it is better now and then from what it was a little while ago. It seems to come and go away.

10 BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Do you know how many treatments you have had here? A. Well, I could not just tell you; a little over 35, -- over that now.

Q. How many? A. 55 and over.
Q. 59 treatments is probably about right?

A. Yes.
