

BY MR. MURPHY: Q. Did you have a letter to Miss Caisse?  
A. Yes, from Dr. Kelley.

Q. And what did it say? A. I cannot just say. He said it was a growth in the abdomen.

COMMISSIONER YOUNG: I would like to know whether the growth was in the stomach? or the large bowel? or the small bowel? or the lower part of the large bowel? It is rather obscure.

COMMISSIONER DEADMAN: Q. How long did you take treatments from Miss Caisse? A. It would be about a year ago last September. Of course, I have taken the odd treatment, but I have not taken it steadily at all.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. After this pus came away, you got a great deal of relief? A. Oh yes.

Q. Was it throbbing before that? A. Yes.

Q. Did you have any temperature or fever with it?

A. Yes.

Q. You were quite sick? A. I was really sick before it broke.

A. Mrs. Sarah Tibbel.

Q. How do you spell it?

A. T-I-B-B-E-L.

Q. And where do you live?

A. Muskoka.

Q. And what doctor did you see in connection with

your health? A. Well, Dr. Bastedo.

Q. At Bracebridge? A. Yes, He sent me down to the Wellesley Hospital, here.

Q. What year? A. About ten years ago. *ML*

Q. What for? A. Cancer.

Q. Where? A. In the uterus, and the vagina.

and Dr. Rush operated on me, and I had Dr. Bruce, and Dr. Elliott -- he was my medical doctor.

Q. Which Dr. Elliott? A. I think at the King Edward. I do not know his name. I forget his initials.

BY COMMISSIONER YOUNG: Q. <sup>Dr.</sup> Ephriam Elliott? *←*

A. Yes.

BY MR. MURPHY: Q. The one armed man?

A. Yes, I was treated, and I had radium for 48 hours, and I got better for six years, and then one came on my head, (right here ( indicating)).

Q. Who told you it was cancer?

A. Dr. Bastedo. I had it six months before I went to him-- I tried everything on it, and it would not heal, and it kept getting worse, and it ran down my arm, and up into my head, and pained me. I had pain in my stomach, and I could not eat.

Q. I went to him, and he said, " You had better go back down to Toronto", and I said, "I cannot stand it"; I have not got over the last radium. I walked down-town, and my doctor said, "Why don't you try nurse" *ML*

Caisse," and I said, " " Well, I really have no faith in her", and he said, " It wouldn't hurt to try it anyway"

So I went to her, and I had ten treatments, and it came off of my hand, and my stomach was better, after taking treatments on and off for about one year.

Q. Is it better? A. Yes, I have my normal weight again, and can eat anything

Q. Do your own work? A. Well, I have rheumatism, I had a bad attack of rheumatism this winter so I could not do all my work yet.

BY COMMISSIONER VALIN: Q. This was just an application she made to it? A. Yes, sir.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Where did you say it was? A. Right there( indicating).

BY COMMISSIONER YOUNG: Q. She did not give you any hypos for that? A. No for that, but she did for my stomach. Dr. Arnold examined it, and when it was broken away, and scaling off -- Dr. Arnold from Ottawa.

BY MR. MURPHY: Q. Answering Dr. Young's statement in connection with the ingredients, in regard to Miss Caisse's preparation. It is the same as applied at the skin on the sore or the cancer, but the solution for taking it is not the ingredients of the serum.

COMMISSIONER YOUNG: You mean the local application does not contain any of the material that is in the serum?

MR. MURPHY: Yes. As given at the clinic. It is the same, but sometimes they get an application to take

out, and that is not the same.

BY THE CHAIRMAN: Q. You gave evidence in Brace-  
bridge? A. Yes.

BY MR. MURPHY: Q. Who was the doctor who examined  
you? What was his name? A. Dr. Hipwell,  
of Orillia.

Q. When did he examine you? A. I don't remember  
the date. It is about two or three years ago, or two  
and one-half years ago.

Q. What did he say was your trouble?

A. He examined me, and found a growth. I could easily  
feel it, but I could not tell how large or what it was.

Q. Of your left breast? A. Yes, and he said  
it was serious, and I should be operated on at once.

I asked permission to go to Miss Caisse, and he  
gave me a verbal permission, but I did not get a written  
letter.

So I went to Miss Caisse, and I think I have taken  
in all about 45 or 50 treatments -- I cannot tell exact-  
ly --

Q. Did you have an X-ray taken? A. No.

Q. Just the diagnosis by Dr. Hipwell?

A. Yes.

Q. And he said you should have it removed?

A. Yes, he said it was serious.
