4. WILLIAM J. O'BRIEN, called,
(Hawkeston, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had an examination from Dr. McQuay of Lockwood Clinic?

A. I went through the Lockwood Clinic last winter.

Q. He apparently diagnosed the prostate gland condition which he said was benign hypertrophy of the gland, which was about February 3rd, last year?

A. Yes.

Q. Almost a year ago? A. Yes.

Q. It would not appear from his statement that he diagnosed cancer, Mr. O'Brien? A. No, they claimed nothing of that sort at all.

Q. I just wanted to let you know that we are dealing with only cancer cases.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: I might say here, Commissioner Wallace that in Mrs. Forsyth's case I have just finished the vaginal examination. On examination of the cervix-uteri, this appeared to be free of any growth or ulceration. I made this examination with a bi-valve speculum and I found the cervix to be absolutely normal. I also made a bimanual examination, and found the uterus to be atrophied. There was no

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haemorrhage.
