that she had a scar on her hand and that is supposed to
be not so, and I thought probably if she was here she
could show that. We just want to clear up what appear
to be small matters that might be contentious at some
later date.

MR. MURPHY: That is marked as an exhibit, I understand, Mr. Chairman?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, it is. It was marked in Bracebridge, apparently, exhibit 35, diagnosis re Mrs. Edith Guppy, November 5, 1937, I don't know where it came from but it is in the record.
