COMMISSIONER WALLACE: We have you make an affirmation that what you say is the truth, but we will take that later? A. Yes.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Your doctors are Dr. Little, and Dr. Little? A. Yes. They are at Barrie. The old gentleman has died since, but Dr. Billy practices in the same place.

Q. They were father and son? A. Yes.

Q. They were the physicians you saw previous to coming here? A. Yes.

Q. Who told you you had something in your mouth? A. Dr. Little.

Q. What did he tell you you had there?

A. He told me I had Leucoplakia.

Q. That is a pre-cancerous condition?

A. Yes.

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Q. You had a lot of white formation all over the inside of your mouth? A. Yes, the inside of the lip.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had permission to take treatments here? A. Here?

Q. Yes? A. Yes, I think it is about two years this month since I came up first, -- the first trip I made.

Q. You have been coming and going; you are not staying here; you come up for treatments, and go away? A. Yes. I require them at home, and I come up here.

Q. How many treatments have you taken since you began, approximately? A. I could not tell you that. I lost my wife this fall, and there were a few months I was not here at all, and ~~this~~ Miss Caisse was ill for a while, and the clinic was closed.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Had you any previous treatment before that? A. No.

Q. You never had treatment until you came to this case? A. No, sir.

Q. Of any kind? A. No, of any kind.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. February 13th, 1937, is the time of your first treatment here? A. Yes.

Q; Had this man advised you to come here, or did you come yourself? A. No, they did not advise me; I heard of this lady and I came.

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BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. Dr. Little had not given you any treatment whatever? A. No.

Q. Did he advise any treatment? A. No, He did not.

Q. He did not advise any treatment? A. No, sir.

Q. Do you smoke a pipe? A. No, I do not,

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: You used to chew tobacco? A. I used to chew some tobacco, all right. *

Q. They told you not to? A. They told me I would be better to go without it.

BY COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: Q. WHAT change did you see after treatment? A. I feel better, and my mouth is not as sore.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: There is a statement here from Dr. Little which I think should be filed as well. It states that Mr. Reynolds is suffering from Leucoplakia, and not only him but his wife as well.

THE WITNESS: She was.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. What about her; did she have any treatment? A. She did some some. She took radium in Toronto for five years. Died

Q. And she came here with you fortreatment? A. She came with me, when I started. She was here the first time I came.

Q. She did not continue to take treatment? A. She did.

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Q. But she died? A. Yes.

Q. All right.

EXHIBIT NO. 5: Diagnosis re Mr. Reynolds, Feb. 12th, 1937.

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. Are you feeling much better? A. I am feeling quite a bit better, I am sure. I am on the farm, you know.

Q. For a time you were unable to work?

A. Well, I was not able to do an awful lot. I kept going, but still I could not do a heavy days work.

Q. You intend to continue treatments here as long as you feel it is advantageous to you?

A. I do.

Q. Your case, is one, where apparently there was no treatment given by anyone until you came here?

A. No treatment whatever.

Q. Nothing except the diagnosis of the medical men? A. That is right.

COMMISSIONER WALLACE: I think that is probably all we will need to have from you, Mr. Reynolds, thank you. Have you come a long distance to be here today?

A. Six miles the other side of Barrie. We call it about 140 miles the round trip. It would be around 70 miles each way.

Q. I suppose you will take treatment before you go back? A. I have taken it.

Q. So it is not a case of your just coming a journey of a few minutes? A. No.

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Q. That is all.

4. WILLIAM J. O'BRIEN, called,
(Hawkeston, Ontario.)

BY COMMISSIONER WALLACE: Q. You had an examination from Dr. McQuay of Lockwood Clinic?

A. I went through the Lockwood Clinic last winter.

Q. He apparently diagnosed the prostate gland condition which he said was benign hypertrophy of the gland, which was about February 3rd, last year?

A. Yes.

Q. Almost a year ago? A. Yes.

Q. It would not appear from his statement that he diagnosed cancer, Mr. O'Brien? A. No, they claimed nothing of that sort at all.

Q. I just wanted to let you know that we are dealing with only cancer cases.

COMMISSIONER CALLAHAN: I might say here, Commissioner Wallace that in Mrs. Forsyth's case I have just finished the vaginal examination. On examination of the cervix-uteri, this appeared to be free of any growth or ulceration. I made this examination with a bi-valve speculum and I found the cervix to be absolutely normal. I also made a bimanual examination, and found the uterus to be atrophied. There was no

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
